members of the Monday and Tuesday sessions as well; indeed, if we had needed their help on Fridays, they would probably have agreed! They always came on time, even though they had to walk from their accommodation, and were very committed.

I once asked them why that was, and Keith said simply, "Because we know what it's like". Having travelled from Germany to London, they had soon found themselves destitute and homeless, not even aware at first that they were entitled to benefits. They were given food parcels several times by local foodbanks, so when they moved to Birmingham they thought it totally logical to volunteer at Ward End, repaying the generosity which they had experienced when in need.

Nothing was ever too much trouble for them! Both were capable of moving heavy crates of food around fast, and Keith's expertise in IT matters was often useful. Val was excellent at meeting and greeting clients when they arrived, though he was not afraid of telling them off if they stepped out of line.

It was a great joy to us when they were successful in obtaining a job - cleaning houses, almost literally anywhere in the country. We miss them hugely, but are very glad for their sake that they are on a more secure financial footing. As with Maddy, another volunteer who came to join us in March and has now found a job, ANFB has proved to be a good stepping stone!
