ASTON AND NECHELLS FOODBANK NEWSLETTER - March 2021

If like me the only things you really know about foodbanks are that people and companies donate food and others benefit from their contributions, then this might shed some light on what actually goes on behind the scenes. I caught up with the Chair of "Can Do 4:13" and Aston and Nechells Foodbank trustee Sharon Palmer MBE to explain more.

Meet Sharon Palmer MBE

"I was invited to be Chair of Can Do 4:13 a couple of years ago. The trustees have a very light touch really. We manage finance, make sure we provide good governance and operate really on a strategic level



rather than a local level - we have a management committee who do that. The whole aim of the charity and project is to alleviate poverty in the area."

Sharon isn't afraid of getting her hands dirty though. "When the pandemic hit, a lot of our loyal volunteers had to isolate for various reasons so we helped out on the ground distributing and collecting food etc. The board of trustees are not so removed that we don't roll our sleeves up and step in when needed."

Sharon's empathy and values run through her like a stick of rock which is why she's the perfect person to be chairing this charity. "There has to be a value structure, empathy and common respect. You are only ever one or two pay checks away from being homeless or in need of a foodbank and we have a lot of professional people who use the service, there is no shame or judgement for those who come here, it's a humanitarian transaction."

Aston and Nechells Foodbank isn't just about giving people food though. "We don't just provide a food provision but we also provide a financial provision by offering advice about money and debt management. We need to also appreciate that there is a difference between having money for food and the quality of food. To buy healthy food you almost need a mortgage, it's cheaper to go up a high street and buy a burger, that needs to change."

Foodbank wouldn't be here without Sharon and her fellow trustees but they're only one of the cogs in the foodbank operational wheel. It wouldn't turn without the volunteers.

"I'm really, absolutely proud of all the volunteers' time, energy and volunteering spirit. Also a huge huge thank-you to our donors. We have donors from preschool children to big companies. Instead of doing Christmas presents etc. Sandwell A & E donated toiletries, nappies and personal care items to our foodbank, stuff that sometimes we overlook."

When we think of foodbanks it's all too easy to become frustrated that they even have to exist in the first place but the positives are crystal clear. "We've had people come in for money management advice and we've never seen them again until they've come back as donors. Many of the users have now become donors as they're now in a better situation and it shows that what we're doing is working, That's a good news story."

DID YOU KNOW?

FAMILY ACTION has launched Food On Our Doorstep (FOOD) clubs to provide good-quality food at a low cost, whilst also reducing food waste. It costs just £1 a year for a family to become a member. Once you've joined, you can purchase a bag of tasty food items every week worth approx. £10-£15 for just £3.50! To become a member you must live or work within 15 minutes of a club.
